What to Know: Hepatitis C Genotypes

Can a patient have a normal liver enzyme (e.g., ALT) level and still have chronic hepatitis C? Yes. It is common for patients with chronic hepatitis C to have fluctuating liver enzyme levels, with

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periodic returns to normal or near normal levels. Liver enzyme levels can remain normal for over a year despite chronic liver disease .

The reason is that HCV often does not have any symptoms until the disease progresses to the point where treatment can no longer help. The best way to prevent infection with HCV is to avoid contact with an infected person's blood, do not share needles, and avoid high-risk sexual ...

Acute hepatitis C usually goes undiagnosed because it rarely causes symptoms. When signs and symptoms are present, they may include jaundice, along with fatigue, nausea, fever and muscle aches. Acute symptoms appear one to three months after exposure to the virus and last two weeks to three months.

Many people with hepatitis C do not have symptoms and do not know they are infected. If symptoms occur, they can include: yellow skin or eyes, not wanting to eat, upset stomach, throwing up, stomach pain, fever, dark urine, light-colored stool, joint pain, and feeling tired.

Go over all the prescription and over-the-counter drugs you take with your doctor. Some may have side effects that can hurt your liver. For example, too much acetaminophen can cause liver damage.

Are some medicines not OK to take if you have hepatitis C?

Hepatitis C is more common than A and B combined. The CDC estimates that 30,500 new hepatitis C infections happened in 2014, while 19,200 people got hepatitis B and 2,500 got hepatitis A that year.
