James intended that his son carry on the radical utilitarian empiricist tradition, and this was reflected in his upbringing: John learned Greek and arithmetic at 3, and helped to edit his father's book (the History of India) at 11. 1

Mill's classic statement of the utilitarian position appeared in 1861 in a series of articles in Fraser's Magazine between October and December 1861. It then was published as a book in 1863. He built his theory on the foundation laid by his father's and his intellectual mentor Jeremy Bentham which became the dominant liberal theory of ethics in the English speaking world in the 19th century.
